Heritage Preparatory School is a classical Christian PreK-12 school providing an academically rigorous educational experience designed to help students know, love, and practice that which is true, good, and excellent and to prepare them to live purposefully and intelligently in the service of God and man. We began in 1998 with fifteen lower school students, adding the high school in 2021. Total school enrollment for 2022-2023 is 256 students with 30 students in grades 9 - 12.
